#### Sunday, July 17 Bennett Park Out-Door Worship

OSLCW - July

Summer has arrived in a big hurry! It will end sooner than we want and this bring to mind schools will soon start. In many countries school is a year long task with short breaks every three months. Many of these students live in refugee camps or are otherwise displaced and need help with basic school supplies. We have been asked why not donate local and as some teachers have said there are many generous groups here on the range helping our local students with needed items, thus we donate backpacks to Lutheran World Relief. It is to our buying power advantage to receive monetary donations aa we are able to buy tax free. However, if you wish to buy needed items are: five unsharpened number two pencils—basic yellow, five Bic style blue or black pens, one 12"/30cm ruler, one child's scissors, one 24 count Crayola crayons, 4 one subject spiral bound notebooks and one 2" eraser. I see where notebooks are now 70 sheets and not 80—shrinkflation! We have the backpacks on hand and hope to do 200 packs.

Quilting will finish for the summer on June 28<sup>th</sup>. First September quilting is the 6<sup>th</sup> and then the following week we will return to Mondays as our quilting day. Time will be 9a-noon. We still have about 5 high school seniors who have not chosen quilts. This past year we sent about 125 quilts to LWR, 50 to Salvation Army and 15 or so local. We have also been given some finished quilts which have gone to church related quilted auctions. The children's quilt tops donated to us will be used for baptism and hospital quilts. Quilters are unique in that we keep making tops and finished quilts and then try to find places to donate them!

We donated \$2,000.00 from pasty proceeds to the ELCA domestic disaster relief fund in June. We still have monies left in that fund. Travis, Linda K., Mike S. and I have decided we will have to start the process of finding a new refrigerator for the church kitchen. There are some \$\$\$ in the kitchen appliance fund but not enough yet for a fridge. The freezer seal on the current one is ripping and often that door doesn't stay shut so causes trouble. If you are ever in church kitchen and hear beeping please check that the doors on that fridge are shut tight.

One goal for the coming 2022-23 church year is to seek more involvement from younger women so that things like pasty bakes, bazaar, donut making, Luther World Relief projects, funeral meal service and even Sunday School can be real and growing with your help. It sounds daunting, but if you choose to just try one thing you will find many friendly and welcoming faces and we are willing to learn new ways to do things more efficiently and differently. At quilting we say tie the knot for the quilt tie the way you know how—no way is perfect!

We encourage you to go on the Women of the ELCA web site and check on the CAFÉ Bible study designed for working and younger women.
