"God's Work/Our Hands Sunday" Sunday, September 11th, 2022 9 a.m.

As the title implies, *God's Work/Our Hands* is a dedicated Sunday out of the church year where we join with other ELCA Churches to celebrate who we are as the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America (ELCA) – *one church, freed in Christ, to love and serve our neighbor.*

These acts of service allow us to explore one of our most basic Lutheran convictions: All of life in Jesus Christ – every act of service in daily calling, in every corner of the life – flows freely from a living, daring confidence in God's grace.

The COVID-19 pandemic brought about significant changes to our world, and we continue to witness how communities across the globe – and within our own backyard – experience COVID's impact. But one thing is certain, we continue to be church *together*. Throughout the ELCA we witness the love and concern God's people have for one another. Our Savior's Lutheran Church, in our humble corner of God's kingdom, continues to support ministries that assist vulnerable people within our community.

We believe God is calling us to reach out to the people in our communities with the message of hope we know in Jesus Christ. As Ephesians 2:8-10 reminds us, God has created us by grace to live in union with Jesus Christ, and has prepared us to live faithful, fruitful lives by the power of the Holy Spirit.

In Jesus Christ, God has reconciled us to God and to each other. As we gather around Word and Sacraments, this life in Christ defines, shapes and guides us as a community of faith, the church. By God's grace we can and do live confidently and generously in this community of faith, and in service to others.

The worship service for Sunday, September 11th, will be crafted around the theme of *God's Work/Our Hands*, and special guests will be invited to proclaim opportunities of service in our community.

Tiffany Schleppegrell, the Executive Director of Project Care Clinics, and Don Brunette, of Access North will be on hand to update us on the mission and service these fine organizations bring to our community. (In addition to their message, there will be service opportunities to assist both Project Care and Access North.)
