# THE RESURRECTION... AND EVERYTHING THAT LEADS UP TO IT.

As I meet the deadline in writing this April *Voice* article to you, I am keenly aware that Holy Week and Easter Sunday are just around the corner (see the front page of the *Voice*), but I am ALSO in the midst of preparing for two funerals; one faithful matriarch, and one faithful patriarch, who have peacefully passed away after living long and faithful lives in this church and in our community.

One cannot help but to be comforted by how closely the funeral liturgy draws from the promises our Lord achieves in his resurrection from the dead. The litany, the prayers, the Creed, the commendation, the committal, the power of these words part the dark clouds of grief and sadness we feel as we sit in the church pew and grieve the loss of a loved one. To summarize...

Almighty God, by the death and burial of Jesus, your anointed, you have destroyed death and sanctified the graves of all your saints. Keep our brother/sister, whose body we now lay to rest, in the company of all your saints and, at the last, raise him/her up to share with all your faithful people the endless joy and peace won through the glorious resurrection of Christ our Lord, who lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and forever. Amen.

Wow! That pretty well sums it up, in nice "churchy" language that we come to appreciate every Sunday that we gather for worship. As I have heard it quoted – and I believe correctly – "every time we come to worship on Sunday morning it's a dress rehearsal for the resurrection."

But getting back to those funeral preparations for that matriarch and patriarch who have lived long and faithful lives on the cusp of Easter Sunday, I firmly believe that EVERY DAY needs to be one where the *promise* of the resurrection has us in dress rehearsal *for* the resurrection.

Of that faithful matriarch, for example, it was said of her that she was "always the host", gathering friend and stranger a like into her home for Bible study, or any other form of Christian fellowship or nurture that was needed. If ever there was anyone who could make deviled eggs sacramental, she could do it!

And of that patriarch, two quotes that summarizes him are, "every day you are writing your funeral obituary, so... live your life accordingly." "Four walls can make a house, but only a family can make a home."

Were these two saints that we have laid to rest perfect? Of course not! They were in need of God's grace and forgiveness as much as anybody. But my point, and I do have one, is this, the promise of the resurrection is with us each and every moment of our lives, with every breath we take, and every move we make.

Easter is NOT a day, nor is it a season, it is a way of life. And we need to live the promise of the resurrection NOW, in the messy, mundane, routine, practical, sacrificial, hardworking, disciplined, and forgiving journey that is called LIFE.

He is Risen! He has Risen, Indeed! Alleluia!

## AN INTRODUCTION TO THE ORGAN IN THE BEGINNING...

Pipes were made of hollow stems in different sizes and strapped together to make an instrument called the Pan Pipes. The pipe organ was invented when someone decided to play a set of pan pipes with a keyboard instead of blowing into each pipe. The pipes were placed into holes on a box called a wind chest.





A bellows was attached to provide the wind. Some of the earliest organs could be pumped and played by the same person. They were called portatives because they could be carried around by a strap over the player's shoulder. According to paintings and stained glass windows, portatives were particularly popular with angels.
