### Transitioning to Sabbatical...

The month of May for me has always been a *transitional* month in the rhythm and life of parish ministry. Confirmation, Sunday School, and choir practices all follow suit with the school calendar taking a break for the summer months.

During the month of May we celebrate the completion of yet another *White Elephant Sale*, we honor our Mothers on Mother's Day, we honor our graduating seniors on Senior Recognition, and the fishing opener reminds us that we will soon be spending a lot more time at the lake – if the weather ever completely warms up!

Yes, the month of May is transitional, hopefully measuring time by the quality of moments spent in the blossoming of spring, and the bloom of summer, rather than meeting fall and winter's deadlines and responsibilities.

And for me - in this season of my life - I am grateful to you folks as the month of May will transition me with the beginning of a sabbatical leave that will start on **Monday, May 22<sup>nd</sup>** and conclude on **Monday, August 14<sup>th</sup>**.

Hopefully as you read this *Voice* article about my sabbatical leave it *does not* come as a surprise to you! We, myself and the leadership of Our Savior's, have tried to be very intentional about the process as the sabbatical leave was approved by the Church Council last October, a Sabbatical Policy has been written, and a Sabbatical Steering Committee has been meeting to: "assure a smooth running of the congregation during the sabbatical leave and to see that the goals of the sabbatical leave are being met."

And just what are the goals of a sabbatical leave? Quoting directly from OSLC Sabbatical Policy we read: "A sabbatical is understood to be a time of release from normal duties in order that a rostered leader [Pastor] may devote time to renewal and study. Communication pertaining to official church business between the rostered leader [Pastor] and the congregation shall discontinue during the sabbatical.

A sabbatical is understood as an integral and important part of an overall strategy for enhancing the mission of the congregation through renewal, development, and growth for the rostered leader. A sabbatical is for the benefit of the rostered leader and the congregation."

When I am asked "what do you plan to do while you're on sabbatical?" The short answer is: "a lot of things that begin with letter 'R'!" I hope to: rest, renew, read, re-create (physical fitness and other outdoor pursuits), restore (better management of my diabetes and my physical and mental health), re-connect (in relationships with family and friends), re-evaluate (What might the final years of my ministry look like at Our Savior's? When and what might a responsible retirement look like?). You get the picture!

With respect to how Our Savior's might directly benefit from my sabbatical leave? One goal is to envision where the Holy Spirit might be calling OSLC to grow and serve in the next 5 to 15 years, and what might be the paradigm shifts, or put more bluntly, "the growing pains" needed to get there? This is a topic that can be explored through many books, zoom, and web seminars.

Retired Pastor Brian Birk (no stranger to OSLC!) will be replacing me while I am gone on sabbatical leave. Pastor Brian will have "quarter time" status while he serves us. The two scheduled days of the week that Pastor Brian will be in residence at OSLC will be Wednesdays and Sundays. In the event of a death in the congregation, Pastor Brian will be available to plan and conduct a funeral, and he will also be available for a pastoral emergency should the need arise. As is the case in getting a hold of me, please call the church office to get a hold of Pastor Brian. The church office phone number is (218) 263-7422.

With respect to filling the leadership void while I am away on my sabbatical, all pastoral concerns (death, hospital visits, Sunday morning worship, etc.) will get brought to Pastor Brian's attention. If there is an administrative concern within the congregation (bills, budget, the building, etc.) please bring that to the Executive Board of the Church Council which includes our Church Council President, John Law, who can be reached at (218) 260-1778; our Church Council Vice President, Kathy Anderson, who can be reached at (218) 929-1291; and our Church Council Secretary, Heather Lubben who can be reached at (218) 966-7835.

We close with some wise words from the Gospel of Mark chapter six, where within the rush and crush of ministry our Lord Jesus acknowledges the need for his servants to: "Come with me by yourselves to a quiet place and get some rest." (Mark 6:31)

To play most early pipe organs, one needed an assistant to pump the bellows. It was handy to have a family member willing to do this boring job. From the beginning pipe organs were made in all different sizes. Large organs were built in churches from at least 1100. These instruments had many pipes and required several huge bellows to provide their wind. The job of a calcant, or bellows-pumper, was quite taxing. One got to rest during the sermon, but then would be wakened by a bell rung by the organist when it was time to start pumping again
