The "Organ Trail"

Well, we are in the midst of it! The first of many steps for the organ restoration project in the balcony at Our Savior's are now in front of us!

As you come to worship, beginning this month in July, you will see a large "umbilical cord" of safely wrapped electrical conduit hanging from the church balcony down to the back of the church. This functional – but unsightly – life-line will provide power for the livestream camera and the soundboard which has now been relocated from the balcony to the back narthex of the church.

Moreover, for the foreseeable future our church balcony will look more like a construction site than an inviting loft that has housed our church choir and church music. But by the grace of God, it will all be worth it!

Following Roy Berg's example and propensity for puns, I have labeled our organ restoration project "The Organ Trail." No, our organ project IS NOT a 2,000-mile arduous route snaking through Missouri into Oregon, BUT THERE WILL BE DAYS in the weeks and months ahead when it might feel that way!

Biblically, another metaphor that we could muse on might be the children of Israel wandering through the desert wilderness to get to the Promised Land. By the grace of God EVERYTHING was provided for the Israelites as God lead them on their journey, all the Israelites needed to do was TRUST God and PROCEED FORWARD.

Compared to the pioneers on the Oregon Trail, or the Israelites wandering in the desert wilderness, our challenges with our *organ trail* will be relatively minor. But God will still provide the manna!

We are grateful to God for responsible contractors who will provide the appropriate containment of dust, and construction debris, so that we can have a clean worship sanctuary from week-to-week.

We are grateful to God for a very competent organ refurbishing company, R.W. Draeger & Co., who will provide world class re-construction for our organ which will last for generations yet to come.

We are grateful to God for the full financial funding of this project through the generosity of so many at Our Savior's. A budgeting that is inclusive NOT only for the estimated construction BUT also for cost overruns. And above all we are grateful for a faithful and dedicated Organ Refurbishing Committee who have scheduled, and planned carefully, for multiple contractors to come and do the work that will be required in the weeks and months ahead.

Some predictable challenges as we journey on our *organ trail* may be supply chain issues, delays in ordering materials, and other construction snafus. And yes, we will miss our pipe organ as we substitute it with the piano and electric organ. But these intentional sacrifices will allow us to appreciate a fully restored pipe organ when that becomes a reality!

History records that it took four to six months for pioneers to journey the Oregon Trail. We are hopeful that our *organ trail* might be concluded by Easter of 2025 (nine months), but it could take also be a little over a year as well; time will tell. But together we look forward to the day when we will be accompanied by our new organ with the tune...

Bless now, O God, the journey that all your people make, The path through noise and silence, the way of give and take. The trail is found in desert and winds the mountain round, Then leads beside still waters, the road where faith is found.

Organ Refurbishment Update

The project has begun in earnest!

With the help of many volunteers, the entire balcony has been cleared out of most items. You have probably noticed all the camera and sound equipment has been set up in the Narthex, and we broadcast our first service from there on June 23. The piano will be removed after the Organs in Review Variety Program at OSLC on June 26 and access to the pipe chamber will be created.

Russell Draeger will arrive on July 8. He and his crew will remove the old organ console. *Please Note: Help is needed on July 11 for removing wind chests from the pipe chamber.* Contact Roy Berg if you can help.

Pipe removal itself will be done by the Draeger crew and take 2-3 weeks. The pipes will be stored in a long, enclosed trailer and a box truck, to be parked on 5th Avenue, adjacent to the west side of the church. The city has granted permission for Draeger to park this trailer and box truck for the 2-3 weeks in July needed for pipe removal.

The balcony will be off-limits to general traffic for the duration of the project. We will continue to provide updates as the project progresses. In the meantime, please feel free to reach out with any questions. Thanks!

Two large boxes of medical supplies and equipment were also sent to Global Health Ministries in Minneapolis on this truck. Gifts to the Salvation Army, the Hibbing Homeless Shelter, Lost Shepherd ministries, to the Catholic Church in honor of quilting group members who died, our church high school seniors, three to charitable group auctions, one to the churchwide Synod Assembly and a few were sold.

As women of the church, we are wondering how to get more interest in group Bible Studies and just good old fashioned social time. I realize times and priorities have changed regarding involvement in the church. For our grandmothers, greatgrandmothers and even mothers this was a social time as well as Bible study for them to gather with other women of their church.
