The mailings have gone out, bulletin inserts have been presented, Temple Talks have been given, and in short order you will receive a letter with a brochure, and a commitment card, asking you to prayerfully consider what your response will be to our Fall financial stewardship campaign *Rich in Christ.* 

To quote from that mailing you have recently received...

On **Sunday, November 3<sup>rd</sup>**, as a part of our All Saint's Day worship, we will celebrate what it means to be **Rich in Christ** by presenting our pledges and commitments (we call them "Statement of Intent") during the worship service...

Your offerings given this year are very important. Much ministry is being accomplished because of your giving. Next year our hopes and prayers are that our yearly offerings will increase by \$61,500 or more so specific ministry challenges will be met. # Organ Restoration Update

Things are beginning to accelerate regarding the preparation in the balcony for the organ. We have had several meetings of the Organ Steering Committee to talk about this progress and selection of materials. The new higher railing has been designed, ordered and is now having a black powder coat applied. It will be a very nice upgrade from what we had. With raising the floor up to the level of the first step, we had to make this increase in height to meet safety code. Also, we have met with plumbers to get a quote on the improvement to the heating system within the organ chambers. We also had a meeting with the electrician about adding and relocating outlets including another circuit for the sound system. The new organ will also call for a dedicated circuit. We will also be upgrading the lighting within the chamber to light both from above and below to make organ servicing easier. We are still waiting for the quote for the new balcony lighting which is intended to give better light for the choir. We have also selected the material for the screen through which the organ speaks. We also await a bid on flooring which includes new stair tread, construction of a platform raising the lowest level in the balcony and laying the porcelain tile in the hall and balcony. There are many parts to this project and each and every part needs to be carefully planned. Joe, Mike and Todd have been such an important part of the headway we have made. Also, Sue Rudberg has taken Julie Jordan's place in co-chairing the Steering Committee.
